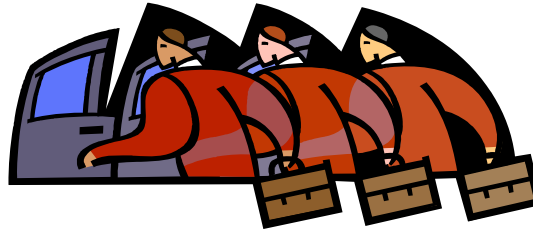


Clean Air Recognition Awards

Commuter Champion Award

In addition to the Clean Air Recognition Award, a Commuter Champion Award is also presented. A Commuter Champion is any organization that provides a commuter choice or benefit to their employees. The award was first initiated in 2008 to recognize a company for their long standing participation in a transit agency's Commuter Value Pass program.

Eligible organizations are not limited to only providing one transit option. A true champion offers a variety of commuter choices or benefits to their employees. Some examples may include, but not limited to:

- Promotion of Rideshare or provide an internal carpool program;
- Provide preferential parking or offer a Guaranty Ride Home for carpoolers;
- Provide or participate in a Vanpool Program;
- Provide free or reduced transit fare;
- Sell or display transit information;
- Provide bike racks, showers or changing facilities;
- Provide incentives to use alternative commutes.
